

2019 BHS Boys Lacrosse Program Overview

Season Overview

- Preseason Practice and Conditioning – Schedule will be posted on the BILAX website.
- Regular Season Timeline: February – June 1, 2019
- Practice Times & Locations: TBD Monday – Friday Alternating with Girls Lax (BHS Stadium or BP Turf) 10 AM - 12 PM Saturdays @ BHS Stadium
- Attendance at all practices is mandatory.
- Preseason Practice and Conditioning is strongly encouraged unless you are participating in a winter sport. Obviously there will be instances where a player's absence from practice is unavoidable; in these cases the player is responsible for notifying his Coach or his Team Captain of his upcoming absence as far in advance as possible. It is critical to note that whenever ANY player is absent from practice it has an impact on both their teammates and their coaches since practice plans are based on the assumption that all players will be present at practice.

Other Considerations

- The move into High School Lacrosse represents a change in focus from the primarily instructional teams of middle school leagues to teams that are focused on competition.
- Playing Time: At the high school level playing time is not guaranteed, it is earned on the basis of skills and team needs and at the discretion of the coaches. As parents it can be very difficult to accept that our children are not playing as much as we had hoped they would or they are not playing the position they want to play but our coaches are professionals and their decisions are made with the best interests of the team in mind.
- Team Assignments: Players are no longer assigned to teams based on age. They are judged on skill level and performance and placed on the team that coaches believe is the best fit for them.
- Finally, coaches expect and demand that the players take responsibility for themselves to communicate directly to their coaches instead of always running things through the parents.

Game Schedule

- Up to a total of 20 games including some Saturday games.
Parent drivers will be required for Varsity away games.

- 2019 Registration fee is \$800- includes \$35 US Lax membership.
- Game shorts and team gloves are required for each high school player. New players must have one blue and one white pair of game shorts. Returning players may not need to purchase shorts.
- Other additional expenses include the Retreat at Fort Worden (\$125) and Portland

Registration

- October 1, 2018 – Registration Open
December 1, 2018 – Registration deadline to be eligible to participate in first practice in February
- If player is not registered, player does not have US Lax Insurance and cannot step on the field.
- Payment Option: Deadline for choosing this option is December 15, 2018 □ There is a 3 installment payment option
